This information will allow parents to support our high impact instruction and better understand the data driven decisions teachers are making.

10. Provide a summary of your Titel I Schoolwide Plan in the box below.

The 2025-2026 Title I Narrative Plan for Centennial Elementary School focuses on improving student proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA) and Math, as well as enhancing overall student engagement and behavior. The plan sets specific goals to increase ELA proficiency to 45% and Math proficiency to 40% by the end of the academic year. To achieve these goals, the school will implement well-structured, rigorous lessons aligned with Florida B.E.S.T. standards. Additionally, the plan emphasizes the use of multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) to address learning gaps within student subgroups, aiming for a 5% increase in proficiency for students with disabilities, English Language Learners (ELL), and Black/African American students. The school will also focus on reducing office discipline referrals (ODRs) by 10% through a consistent school-wide behavior system.

Funding will support various initiatives, including hiring additional teachers to lower class sizes, and retaining our behavior specialist and IA to improve student engagement and reduce ODRs. The plan also allocates resources for instructional materials such as subscriptions. Professional development for teachers will be provided to ensure effective implementation of instructional strategies and behavior management systems. Parent and family engagement activities, such as conference nights and data discussions, will be funded to strengthen the homeschool connection and support student achievement. Overall, the plan aims to create a supportive and effective learning environment that addresses both academic and behavioral needs.
